Senior Warning Signs for Government Scams

Fraud is very prevalent in today's society especially when it comes to seniors. The fraudsters contact seniors and claim to be representatives from a well-known government agency which could be the Internal Revenue Service, Medicare, or even the Social Security Administration.

Fraudsters may use caller ID spoofing to make the call seem genuine. And once you're on the line, they may request your Social Security number to identify you so the call would seem legitimate.

During tax season, fraudsters may call and claim to be from the Internal Revenue Service and use scare tactics and may say there is an issue with your tax

return. They may ask for your personal information and say they want to assist you to secure your tax file, but they may actually file a phony tax refund.

Fraudsters may claim to be Medicare representatives and may call and ask you to verify your Medicare number. They may use it to steal your health benefits. They may also tell you that you need to pay a fee to receive a new card or get special treatment.

Fraudsters may call and claim that your social security number has been suspended due to an alleged crime. They may tell you that in order to reinstate it, they will need payment and may ask for your credit card number.

Always keep in mind that these agencies usually will not reach out to you via phone. Never give out your social security number, Medicare number, or credit card numbers unless you initiate the request. If you receive a call, do not continue the conversation. Make it a point to call the agency's official phone number to inquire.



As far west as Katy, and as far south as Pasadena and Clear Lake. But we were also privileged to have some attendees who lived within a 5-mile radius of our church.

At the culmination of this year's VBS session, we had the amazing opportunity to offer each child and volunteer a "Following Jesus Changes the Game" t-shirt and a FREE trip to the Houston Museum of Fine Arts. Throughout this weeklong event we were delighted to have experienced over 258 interactions with our children. We were also blessed to have as many as forty gracious volunteers help us serve our children. And in the end, twenty-three kids filled out and submitted a decision card to make Jesus their "forever friend."

As we continue to do God's work and share his love with each child that we encounter, we ask that you continue to keep Berean's Children's Ministry in your prayers. It is our prayer that we can provide each child the support, love, and the wisdom they need to follow Jesus. In the nearby future, we would like to reignite our Berean Adventurers and Pathfinders Clubs. 
